The Volunteer Services Department at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh of UPMC is proud to showcase the gems in out midst – out volunteers. We are fortunate to have so many dedicated, and passionate individuals who devote their time and energy while exemplifying the core values of patient-and family-centered care.

It's hard to capture all of the extraordinary services volunteers have provided to patients and families at Children's Hospital in this single report. In 2014 alone, 1,189 volunteers gave their support to various areas of the hospital. Looking ahead, the Volunteer Services Department at Children's Hospital will continue to align the talents and skills of our generous volunteers with opportunities to meet the ever-important needs of our patients and their families.

#### BY THE NUMBERS - VOLUNTEER SUPPORT INCREASES IN 2014

The numbers don't lie. Volunteer support continued to grow in 2014. In 12 months, Children's volunteers clocked in more than 43,000 hours of service. Here's the breakdown:

When comparing the totals from the previous year, the total volunteer count significantly jumped. In 2013, our total volunteer count (number of different people who clocked in/out) was 776. In 2014, that number grew to 1,189.

#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PAST YEAR

- Volunteer Services is now part of a larger department that includes Child Life and the Family Resource Center.
- In an effort to give back to Children's, numerous former patients are serving as volunteers.
- New and renewed assignments were added in a variety of areas including Radiology, the Operating Room, and Patient Transport's Concierge Discharge Program. Volunteers also helped with Child Life and Family Life activities and events – providing comfort and support for patients and families.
- Volunteers provided support at other locations including Children's Hospital Rehabilitation Unit, Children's East in Monroeville, Children's Pine Center in Wexford and Children's North in Wexford.
- Volunteer Services and other department administrative support increased.
- During the busy holiday season, volunteers were invaluable as they helped Child Life and hospitality staff during high-volume donation periods.
